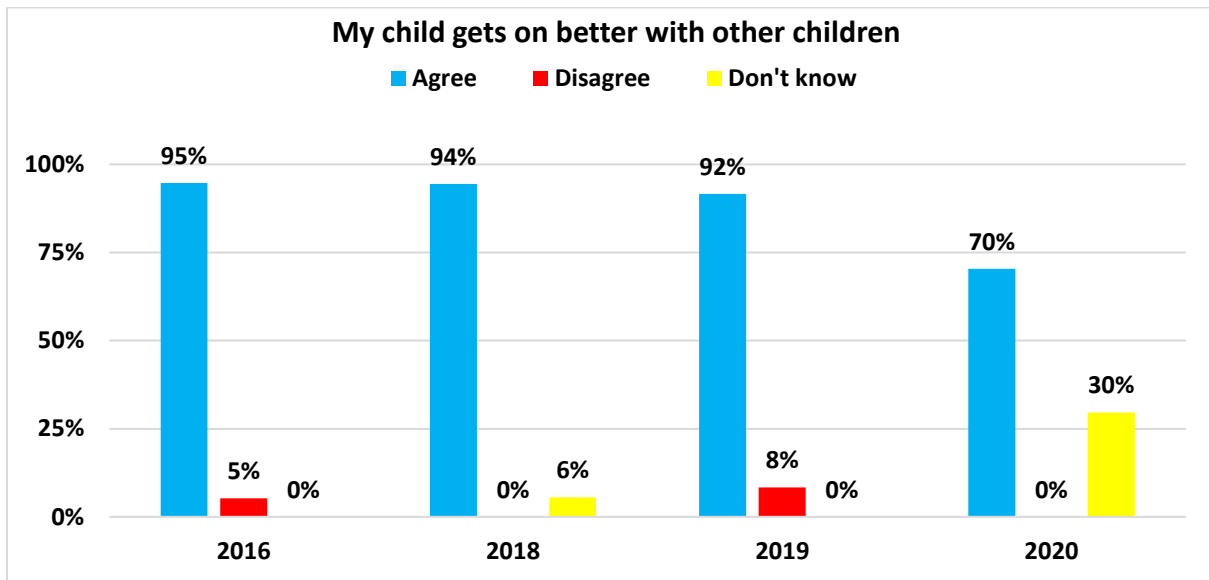
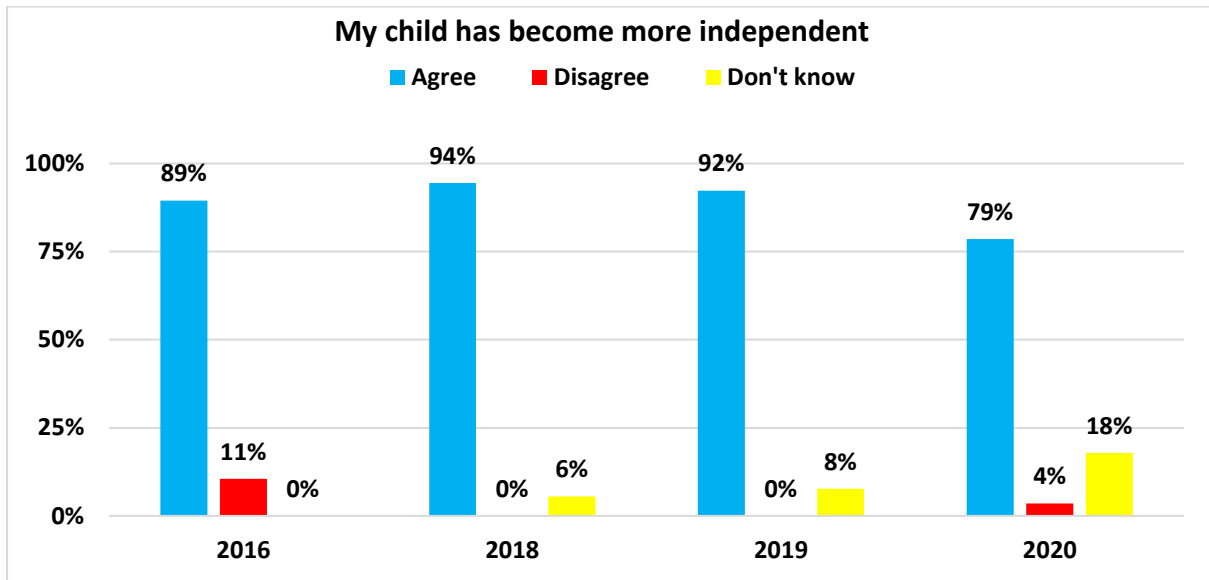
## What has your child gained from coming to the Sulgrave Club?
