




2018 Senior Summer Holiday Activity Scheme


The 2018 Senior Summer Holiday Activity Scheme, which consisted of three outings a week for three weeks, took place over nine days, from Tuesday 24th July to Thursday 9th August 2018:



In total, 32 young people took part at an average of 14.3 per day, broken down as follows:















Aims


Our primary aims for the holiday scheme were to increase young people's confidence, improve their social skills, and make them happier. At the end of the scheme we asked the young people to assess how well we had achieved these aims. 65% told us they had become a lot more confident, and 90% that they now got on a lot better with other people. 90% also told us the scheme had made them a lot happier.







We also asked the young people about other potential benefits of the scheme. We converted their answers into scores out of 100, which allowed us to produce the chart below. This shows that, the young people felt they benefited most from being kept positively engaged and active, and benefited least in terms of improvements to their behaviour and being helped to keep out of trouble.

Impact

We also asked the young people why they thought that holiday schemes were important for people their age. This year there was a more or less equal split between those who thought keeping young people out of trouble was the most important aspect of a holiday scheme, with those who thought keeping young people active and engaged, particularly on activities that they would not otherwise be able to experience.

Why do you think holiday schemes for young people your age are important?

- To help keep them out of trouble.
- Because it keeps them out of trouble and also gives an opportunity for people to try diverse and unusual things that they wouldn't do otherwise.
- To be safe and to stay out of any trouble.
- Because they are usually in trouble and I think it gives them something exciting to do.
- Holiday Schemes are important for people my age because they keep them out of trouble.
- It keeps them out of trouble and allows them to try new things.
- Because it's a chance to have fun and stay out of trouble.
- So people our age can stay out of trouble and have fun. Everybody loves Sulgrave.
- So that they can get to improve their behaviour, and also for them to develop their friendships and to build bonds.
- To get to be more active and grow new skills.
- It helps us get out and active.
- Because it is very interactive and gives you stuff to do during the holidays.
- Because it keeps us active.
- It gives us something to do and keeps us active, so we are not bored.
- It allows us to be proactive and do things we would not do on a day to day basis.

- For us to have more fun and experiences.
- So they can experience more stuff that their parents won't do with them.
- So they can experience things that they might not be able to experience when they become an adult.
- To get out of the house and be social.
- It is important because it keeps young people out of the streets and doing much more fun things.

- I enjoyed spending time with the Sulgrave family and they are sociable, fun, and also make me more confident.

Summary

The main success of the project was that during the summer holidays we offered 32 young people the chance to participate in a wide range of challenging and fun activities that they would not have been able to afford to do on their own. Because of their participation they experienced improvements in confidence, friendships, and fun; were kept active and positively engaged for a significant part of their summer holidays; were motivated to try new things; and now feel much more part of the "Sulgrave" family.
